#### **NEW GUIDANCE**

Earlier this week, the Government announced plans to move Cheshire West and Chester and Cheshire East into the 'high alert level' of the new coronavirus lockdown measures. Essentially this means that people must not meet with anybody outside their household or support bubble in any indoor setting—whether at home or in a public place. People must not meet with more than 6 outside, including your garden or public spaces. Levels are continually being assessed and changed according to levels in each area of the country.
