





VOLUNTEERS OFFICIALLY REWARDED FOR THEIR WORK



On Wednesday 11th November, David Briggs, Lord-Lieutenant of Cheshire, formally handed over to OPAL volunteers the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. The virtual event took place prior to OPAL's Annual General Meeting and attended by over 60 guests. Jane Colville, Chair of Trustees, received the award on behalf of all OPAL's volunteers. "We are delighted to have been recognised by the Queen for the work we undertake for older people and carers in rural communities. Although we received notification of the award earlier this year, COVID-19 has meant we needed to adjust the 'usual' presentation of the award. It was amazing to see so many faces on the Zoom session".

David Briggs commended our volunteers saying "You are truly stars. OPAL is a special charity and you are spreaders of happiness. This is the highest award a group of volunteers can be given—the equivalent of an MBE".

MR DAVID BRIGGS, MBE, KSTJ, HER MAJESTY'S LORD-LIEUTENANT OF CHESHIRE
