I am an English singer-songwriter and actor.

I studied art, music and design before embarking on a professional career as a musician in 1963.

I released Space Oddity in 1969 and in 1981 I collaborated with Queen in *Under Pressure*. I reached my commercial peak in 1983 with Let's Dance which topped the UK and US charts.

My movie roles included Major Jack Celliers in *Merry* Christmas, Mr. Lawrence (1983), Jareth the Goblin King in Labyrinth (1986).

# This is Your Life.....

### **CARY GRANT**

## **Birthplace**

He was born on 18<sup>th</sup> January 1904 in Bristol, England and was called Archibald Alexander Leach

## An early memory

At the age of 9, he returned home from school to find his mother missing. He was told she had gone to the seaside but had been admitted to a mental institution, something he did not find out for many years.

#### Career

At the age of 14, he lied about his age, forged his father's signature and joined Bob Pender's troupe of knockabout comedians. In 1920, he was one of 8 Pender boys selected to go to the United States. The show "Good Times" ran on Broadway for 456 performances. He changed his name to Cary Grant when he started making movies as he needed a name that sounded more American. He went on to make many films including North by Northwest and To Catch a Thief.

#### **Personal life**

He married 5 times and became a father for the only time at the age of 62 when his 4<sup>th</sup> wife Dyan Cannon gave birth to their daughter. He died in 1986 aged 82
